

#### Girl Scouts of Westmoreland Troop 16380 earned their Bronze Award by

creating a sensory board for the Murrysville Community Library. The board was made entirely through donated materials, and the girls also designed flyers and bookmarks about interacting with people who have developmental disabilities.



**To earn her Girl Scout Silver Award, Kendall Laurin** aimed to get children outdoors by creating an educational storybook trail at Asbury Woods. The trail featured laminated pages from a book called *The Birdwatchers*, and she also produced a virtual tour of the trail for the Asbury Woods website.



**Gold Award Girl Scout Ella** Mae Niemi focused her Gold Award project on cross-cultural communication centered on the concept of IDEA: inclusion, diversity, equity, and access for immigrant and refugee students. She organized a fullday, student-led event that provided a forum for English as a Second Language (ESL) students to share their cultural heritage with over 200 students. The students who have participated in the program will continue to incorporate it annually during the school's Cultural Day event.





After volunteering at YMCA's "My Turn to Tri" Special Needs Triathlon, Gold Award Girl Scout Jillian Fishell observed the need for participants to be more mentally and physically prepared. She created workout plans and instructed classes, teaching proper stretching and exercise techniques. Her plans will continue to be used for future YMCA classes for those with special needs. Jillian was also our council's recipient of the 2023 GSUSA Gold Award \$10,000 Scholarship.

Gold Award Girl Scouts are lifelong leaders who put the causes they believe in into action.



Nearly all Gold Award Girl Scouts (99%) hold leadership roles in their everyday lives—at school, in their careers, or through volunteer work—and seven in ten hold three or more leadership roles.



Gold Award Girl Scout alums report that the Gold Award process helped them develop essential twenty-first-century employment skills, giving them a boost in their academic and professional lives.



Alums also affirm that the Gold Award helped them get into college or graduate programs, earn scholarships, and secure jobs.

## Their Year of Discovery




To support our ongoing commitment to mental wellness, two of our council staff members and 31 seasoned volunteers have been trained in Youth Mental Health First Aid this year. Because of a grant from the Staunton Farm Foundation, we will be able to deliver additional mental wellness training to staff and volunteers, resources for parents and caregivers, and programs for girl members.

## **Exploring STEM**

Thanks to a generous grant from NiSource Foundation and Columbia Gas, our council provided 70 *Think Like an Engineer* program kits, reaching 526 Girl Scouts of all ages in Clarion, Clearfield, Warren, and Venango counties. These program kits contained

materials needed to complete three ageappropriate engineering challenges. Funds from NiSource Foundation and Columbia Gas will help provide additional kits to troops in Beaver, Fayette, Lawrence, and Washington counties.

## Learning Life and Leadership Skills

The **Girl Scout Cookie Program** teaches Girl Scouts five skills that will last a lifetime and helps them develop an entrepreneurial mindset. Girls learn to:

- · Set goals and create a plan to reach them.
- · Make decisions on their own and as a team.
- · Create a budget and handle money.
- Find their voice and build confidence through customer interactions.
- · Act ethically, both in business and in life.



Our cookie entrepreneurs learned all about the challenges of supply and demand this past cookie season, managing an omni-channel business and creating innovative solutions. They rose to the challenge, selling over 2.1 million packages of cookies. These cookie business CEOs learned lifelong skills in inventory logistics, resilience, and goal setting, with a total of \$1.9 million going back to Girl Scout troops.

Girls earn proceeds from both the MagNut and cookie programs, allowing them to fund camp, travel, and outdoor adventures, troop community service projects and activities, and more. See how Travel Troop 52619 used their proceeds on page 9.

## **Building Campfires & Confidence**

Nearly 1,650 Girl Scouts participated in camp this year, connecting with new friends and building the courage to try new things. Highlights from 2023 summer camp include:

- Camp Conshatawba hosted a drama session, as well as a session where girls experienced all four of our camps in one week. At each camp, they tried a different water activity—canoeing, stand-up paddleboarding, and kayaking. The girls also did a one-night backpacking trip off camp.
- Camp Hawthorne Ridge hosted travel sessions to Niagara Falls, Mammoth Caves National Park, and Presque Isle State Park. This is the second year we ran a scuba session where girls got to experience scuba diving and snorkeling in Lake Erie.



- Camp Redwing ran five weeks of day camp and hosted two overnight experiences for campers. Many of these campers were Girl Scout Brownies who are looking forward to attending overnight camps in 2024.
- Camp Skymeadow successfully ran multiple horse programs for all age groups and took girls off camp to explore art at the Greensburg Art Center.



## Angel Sprite Memorial Fund

The first 75 girls who registered for day camp at Camp Redwing received a discount thanks to a generous donation from the Angel Sprite Memorial Fund. This fund was established in memory of Angel "Sprite" Morris, who held a special place in her heart for Camp Redwing.





# Celebrating 100 years of Camp Redwing

During the weekend of August 11-13, 2023, Girl Scouts of all ages came together to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Camp Redwing! The weekend-long celebration included historical tours, camp games, water activities, vendors, canoeing, and more.

## **Exploring the World**

After three years of delays, Travel Troop 52619—made up of Girl Scout Juniors, Seniors, and Ambassadors from Greenville to Greene County and everywhere in between—set foot in Ecuador and the Galápagos Islands. The troop worked hard to fund their trip by participating in the MagNut and Girl Scout Cookie programs, wrapping Christmas gifts, organizing Journey days, collecting used shoes (over 3,500 pairs!), and more.

### **Girl Scout Destinations**

Girl Scout Destinations is the ultimate adventure program for girls to travel with fellow Girl Scouts across the country, see and learn new things, and create life-changing memories. Five Girl Scouts from our council received D-Pass Funding and attended six different Girl Scout Destinations trips this year.

### **Awards of Distinction**

Girl Scouts Western Pennsylvania honored 13 exceptional women and two Gold Award Girl Scouts for their accomplishments and leadership at the annual Awards of Distinction event, presented by PPG and held at the Carnegie Science Center. This annual event honors inspirational women and celebrates the mission of the Girl Scout Movement, which is to build girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

#### 2023 Girl Scout Honorees



#### **Girl Scout of Distinction**

To overcome language barriers that create healthcare inequality. Gold Award Girl Scout Noelle Kraeger from Quaker Valley High School designed and illustrated a bilingual flip-card book to facilitate better communication between healthcare teams and members of the Latino community. The books were installed in local healthcare units and pediatric offices, and over 75 bilingual children's books were distributed to Latino families in her community.

#### Girl Scout Humanitarian

After investigating environmental shifts and factors in Costa Rica, **Gold Award Girl Scout Sophia Gledhill** educated her peers and community about the significant harm this environmental issue is causing the Earth. She taught classes on how to reduce ecological impact through Eco Bricks, and she created videos and a website in an ongoing effort to educate more people across the world.

The **Honor Pin** recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, which has had a measurable impact on two or more geographic areas of service, allowing the council to reach and surpass its mission-delivery goals.


